

LEAD MAINTENANCE MECHANIC (ELECTRICAL)*

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS: Under the general supervision of a higher level employee, the incumbent oversees and performs a variety of adjustments, inspections, installations, and repairs to electrical equipment and systems within a municipality. Work is performed with considerable independence and is initiated by oral instructions or written work orders. The incumbent plans and oversees the work of a general maintenance crew. Does related work as required.

EXAMPLES OF WORK: (Illustrative Only)

Oversees and assigns a work crew to various electrical and maintenance repair tasks (i.e. electric controls for heating systems, installation of light fixtures and outlets.);

Oversees and plans the wiring and installation of equipment and fixtures, such as electric motors, generators, motor controllers, switches, and transformers;

Oversees and assists in the installation and repair of electrical systems for municipal buildings (i.e. communications equipment, fire alarm systems, heating and lighting systems);

Inspects work completed for conformance to local and state electrical codes and given work orders;

Maintains records of work completed;

Prepares written evaluation on subordinates;

Prepares written reports pertaining to work projects;

Assists in preparation of Department's budget;

Requisitions supplies, materials, and equipment needed for repair work;

Responds to municipal emergencies (i.e.: heating problem, etc.);

Uses computer applications or other automated systems such as spreadsheets, word processing, calendar, e-mail and database software in the performance of the duties of the position.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND ATTRIBUTES: Thorough knowledge of the tools, techniques, and terminology in the electrical trades; thorough knowledge of the accident and safety precautions of the trade; ability to perform and interpret work from rough sketches, blueprints or diagrams; ability to oversee and give effective direction to the work of others; ability to follow oral and written instructions; ability to coordinate work with the work of other trades; ability to work independently; initiative in planning and completing repair work; ability to read, write, understand and communicate in English sufficiently to perform the essential functions of the position; ability to use computer applications such as spreadsheets, word processing, e-mail and database software; physical strength and agility; physical condition commensurate with the demands of the position.

MINIMUM ACCEPTABLE TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE: Possession of a Master Electrician License issued by the Westchester County Electrical Licensing Board in accordance with Sections 277.702 and 277.707 of Westchester County Law Article XVII.

SPECIAL NOTE: The appointing authority is responsible for ensuring that the above mentioned license is current and maintained throughout the course of employment.
